**2 Classic Sudoku**

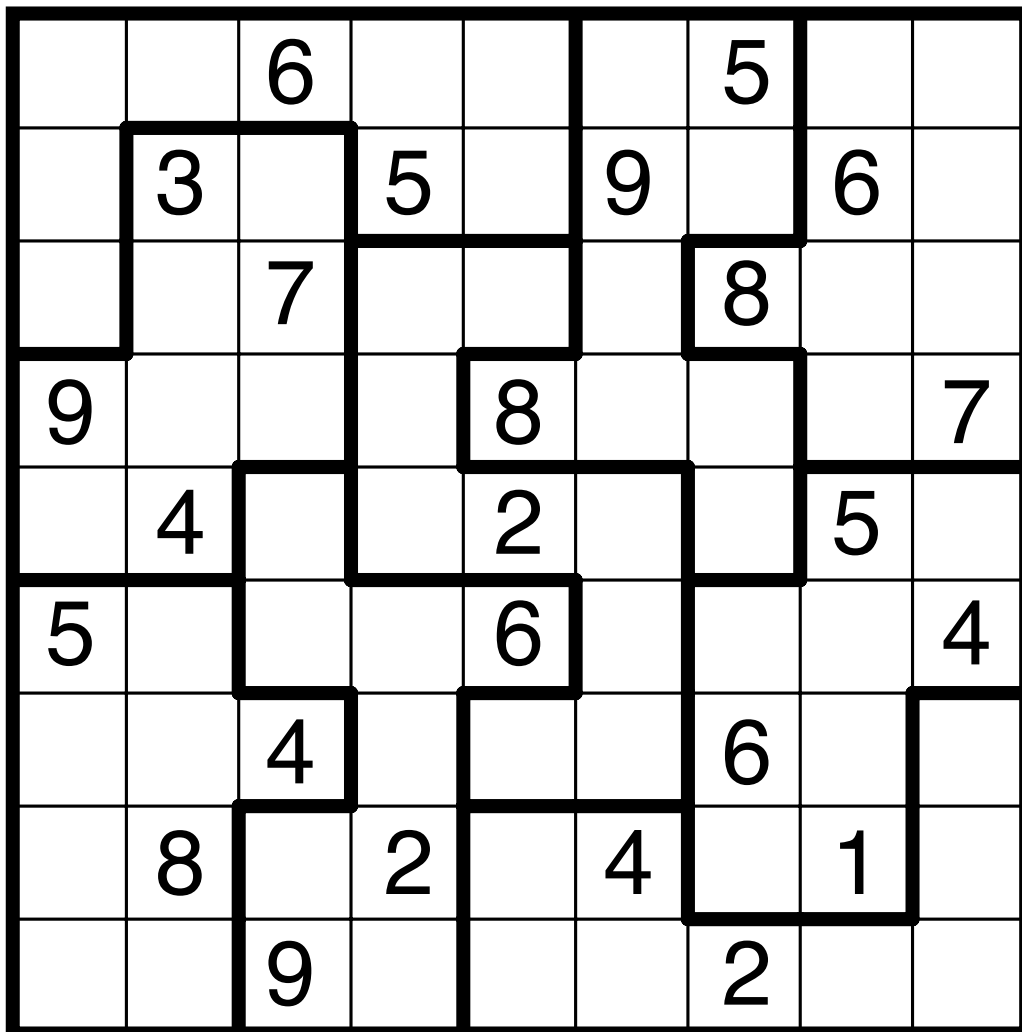
Place a digit from 1 to 9 in each empty cell so that each digit appears exactly once in every row, column, and outlined 3×3 region.

3 Irregular Sudoku

Apply Classic Sudoku rules. Additionally, instead of 3×3 regions, the regions have irregular shapes.

5 Triomino Sudoku

Place a digit from 1 to 6 into each empty cell or blacken the cell so that each digit appears exactly once in every row, column, and outlined 3×3 region along with three black cells. Each black cell should be part of an orthogonally connected group of three blackened cells (a triomino). No two triominoes can share an edge.
